MEMORIAL DAY - A LOCAL TOUCH

Over the past several months, you might have noticed banners being hung from lampposts throughout Wayne commemorating local residents who served our country in the military, many of whom died in battle. It's a great way to honor those who went to war and often gave their lives to ensure our freedom and I commend Marty Costello, who owns Joe's Place, and others who spearheaded this initiative. Marty also arranged to have banners of two men connected with our parish hung on our parish grounds and I would like to highlight them as we prepare to observe Memorial Day.

On Aberdeen Avenue, between the church and rectory, hangs a banner in honor of Lawrence J. Merschel. Larry was born in Wayne on 22 March 1948, the son of John and Virginia. He grew up with his seven siblings - John, Suzanne, Catherine, Peggy, Thomas, Mary Beth and James - on the corner of Pembroke and Aberdeen Avenues. He attended our school and then went on to attend Radnor High School. where he excelled in basketball, becoming the team's captain in his senior year. He graduated in 1966 and enrolled at Villanova University with a full basketball scholarship. He chose to leave college in his freshman year and enlisted in the Army in April 1967; he was killed in action in Vietnam on 1 May 1968. His funeral Mass was celebrated here at St. Katharine of Siena a few weeks later with a large contingent of his 101st Airborne Unit in attendance.



The banner honoring Lawrence DiSipio hangs in front of our church on Lancaster Avenue. Larry was a 1941 graduate of Radnor High School. He enlisted in the Army the next year and served as an army medic in the European theater during World War II. He used to recount that, on one occasion, he tried to save the life of a fellow soldier on a battlefield in Germany; the soldier died in his arms. Larry prayed to God, promising that, if he made it home alive, he would never leave home again. God kept his side of the bargain and so did Larry. After his honorable discharge in 1945, Larry returned to Wayne worked for many years here at St. Katharine parish; his children attended our school.



Memorial Day, which is observed on the last Monday of May, and Veterans Day, observed on 11 November in commemoration of the end of World War I, are two very important National Holidays that call us to honor those members of our families and communities who have served in one of the military branches to protect the freedom we so cherish. I encourage you to spend a moment in prayerful remembrance of these men and women and in thanksgiving to God for the great service they gave to our country.

Parish Nurse Ministry
