SUMMER PROJECTS UPDATE

It's hard to believe that summer is coming to an end; I hope you've enjoyed some time for rest and relaxation! As we do every summer, this year, we have undertaken a number of projects throughout our parish facilities. The gym floor was resurfaced again this summer; this cost \$1,969. It was completely refinished eight years ago at a cost of \$12,100 and regular resurfacing (i.e., applying additional coats of polyurethane) extends the life of the floor before it requires a complete refinishing. This care is needed for the safety of all who use the gym since the floor becomes dangerously slippery as the polyurethane wears off.

In school, all of the hard surface floors were stripped and waxed. This is done every summer to prepare for another busy school year; the cost for this work is \$9,923. And, Chris Plasha, our Parish Facility Manager, and Greg Schmidt, our School Maintenance Man, have been hard at work all summer completing a project begun three years ago: repairing the windows throughout the school. Many of them could not be opened due to worn and broken parts in the opening assemblies. Looking at the number of windows in our school, you can well imagine that it has been a long and tedious project and Chris and Greg took the opportunity of disassembling and reassembling many of the windows to give them all a good cleaning, as well; they look great and finally open again!



But, the major summer project was beginning to prepare our church for our new pipe organ. Our *Keys to the Kingdom* project is beginning to become noticeable! I'm sure you have noticed that Msgr. Carroll's confessional was converted into a space for an organ console and a temporary organ has been installed, complements of *Cunningham Piano*. This will allow us to have an organ to use while the choir loft is prepared for the new organ; that will continue over the next year in preparation for the installation of the *Fratelli Ruffatti* organ, which is scheduled for October 2020.

If you look up in the choir loft, you will also see that the organ has been removed. As the dismantling of the organ progressed, its poor quality and intended temporary nature became even more evident. It was cobbled together with some wooden pipes taken from the organ in our original church (built in 1893) and some metal pipes that had been used first at the Philadelphia Convention Center for some events and then at the Philadelphia Museum of Art for the 1965 National Organ Teacher's Convention and then installed here in preparation for the opening of our new church in 1966. New wooden and metal pipes were added to complete the organ in an attempt to make it more suitable for church use. But, as I have mentioned in the past, it was not originally constructed for church use and has served us for these 50 years with serious limitations, most important, lack of expression - that is, the ability to increase or decrease volume of a given stop.

As you listen to the loaner organ, I invite you to notice a few things. First of all, you will hear that a much wider variety of musical instruments are being represented; trumpet, oboe, flute are among my favorites. And, you will notice a much greater range in volume. The digital organ has two expression pedals. These allow the organist to change the volume from a whisper to a roar, regardless of the stop that is being used. As I mentioned above, our old organ didn't have this feature so the only way to adjust volume was to change or reduce stops. This is one of the very important features that our new organ will have, as well. It is an essential feature for a good church organ since the organist needs to adjust the volume frequently, playing loudly to introduce a musical piece or provide an intermezzo and then more quietly as the congregation sings the hymns. This digital organ, which Cunningham Piano has generously lent us as we prepare for the arrival of our new pipe organ, will allow us to enjoy some of the features of a good organ that had been missing for so long. Imagine what the new organ will sound like!

As we enjoy the features of this new organ, I imagine some will ask, "This digital organ sounds just fine; why spend so much on a new pipe organ?" I would respond with, "Why spend so much on going to a sporting event or a concert when you can watch it on television? Why spend so much to go away on vacation when you can watch a video of the places you are going to visit right at home? Why do we spend so much on real flowers to decorate the church when silk flowers look just as nice?" A digital organ provides a copy of the sound of a pipe organ; it's not the real thing. I think you can agree that God deserves the real thing. That's why we have real granite altars, real wooden furniture made of the finest mahogany, real terrazzo floors and really beautiful stained glass windows. Imitations of all of these would have been much less expensive but the faithful of our parish who paid for the construction of our church - more than \$7 million in today's dollars - understood the importance of having

the real thing when it came to worshiping God. Now, we have the privilege of adding a pipe organ – built not for an organ teachers' convention as our old organ was but specifically for our church – so that we can worship God, who must always be at the center of our lives, even more beautifully. This will be our legacy to future generations of parishioners for years to come!

Let me take this opportunity to thank those who have already contributed to this important project. Our Keys to the Kingdom Campaign is less than a year into its three year term and we're halfway to our goal. For those who haven't gotten involved, you will find brochures at the church entrances with return envelopes. Please take one home and, in the spirit of giving God the real thing, give generously in praise and thanksgiving to God. Enjoy the rest of the summer; September is just around the corner!
