ANNUAL EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION

Every year, I work with our parish Worship Committee and our staff to identify a good guest preacher for our annual *Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion*. This year, I invited Fr. Scott Reilly, L.C., our Sunday Assistant who regularly offers engaging and enlightening homilies for our inspiration. I was delighted when Fr. Reilly accepted my invitation with his usual enthusiasm. A few days later, he called to ask me to explain how we celebrated this devotion. Since he is from Illinois, he was not familiar with it; in fact, he had never participated in such a devotion. When I explained the schedule, he commented with surprise, "Oh, it really is 40 hours!" I laughed to myself as I realized that I just assumed every priest knew about this special tradition that we hold so dear here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. I had to remind myself that this devotion is not celebrated in most other dioceses today, even though it has a long history in our Church. Although its origins are lost in time, St. Charles Borromeo, the patron saint of our seminary who was the archbishop of Milan from 1564 – 1584, wrote about this devotion, known in Italian as *Quarant'Ore*, as if it were already well established in his day. It was probably started to counter the claim of the Protestant Reformation that our Lord was not really present in the Blessed Sacrament and that Holy Communion was just a memorial of the Last Supper.

As you know, we believe that, when we celebrate Mass, we participate in the Paschal Mystery, the once-and-for-all offering of our Lord to us for our spiritual nourishment at the Last Supper and our Lord's offering of himself on the cross to his heavenly Father for the forgiveness of our sins. And, as we read in *Sacramentum Caritatis* (§ 66):

Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharistic celebration, which is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration... The act of adoration outside Mass prolongs and intensifies all that takes place during the liturgical celebration itself.

In the opening paragraph of his encyclical, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, Saint Pope John Paul II provided a powerful reminder of the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of all followers of Christ:

The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is "the source and summit of the Christian life. ... For the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our Passover and our living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to all." Consequently, the gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love.

We need our Lord in our lives and are blessed that he has given himself to us in this clear sign. We truly receive him, body and blood, soul and divinity, whenever we receive Holy Communion. We are truly in his presence when we come before him in the Blessed Sacrament, whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar.

Every year, we are privileged to set apart some time to be with our Lord exposed in the Blessed Sacrament during our annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion. This year, our Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion will be held next week: 13 – 15 October. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on Sunday, 13 October, after the 11:30am Mass and remain exposed until Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7:00pm. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed on Monday and Tuesday after the 8:00am Mass and remain exposed all day. On Monday evening, there will be Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7:00pm. On Tuesday evening, the Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion will conclude with Mass, Procession and Benediction at 7:00pm.

I invite everyone to come and join in to spend some time before Our Lord truly present to us, exposed for our adoration and worship, inspiration and direction! You will find a sign-up board on the table next to the piano and you are encouraged to commit to one-half hour or more for private adoration. And, if you need some inspiration to help you, bring a Bible along and reflect on the Eucharistic passages found in all the Gospels as well as Paul's first letter to the Corinthians (cf. *Matthew* 14:13-21; 15:32-39; 26:17-30; *Mark* 6:34-44; 8:1-21; 14:12-26; *Luke* 22:7-30; *John* 6:1-15, 25-69; 13:1-17:26, *1 Cor* 11:23-29).

Blaze is a Walking with Purpose ministry for girls in grades 7 and up. It was created to counteract the way our society drives girls to question their identity, worth and beauty. Through Blaze, we emphasize how a girl's identity is rooted in Christ as God's chosen, beloved daughter. An antidote to bullying, anxiety and body-image issues, Blaze replaces lies with truth and strengthens girls from the inside out through the use of Scripture-based programs.

Sign-Up for Blaze:

- 20-week curriculum that calls out the way girls are exposed to the lies of our culture that damage their self-worth and sabotage their efforts to follow Christ.
- Meets 1hr each week in the evenings for 20 weeks: Includes icebreaker, story, prayer circle, take-away gift. Begins in Fall.
- Each week a specific lie is replaced with the truth found in Scripture
