PARISH ACTIVITIES RESUME IN THE MIDST OF A PANDEMIC

Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and precede him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone. Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore, was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it. During the fourth watch of the night, he came toward them, walking on the sea. When the disciples saw him walking on the sea they were terrified. "It is a ghost," they said, and they cried out in fear. At once Jesus spoke to them, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid." Peter said to him in reply, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was he became frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" After they got into the boat, the wind died down. Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying, "Truly, you are the Son of God." (Mt 14:22-33)

The gospel account of Jesus walking on water in the stormy Sea of Galilee, Peter getting out of the boat but then, frightened, beginning to sink, only to be saved by Jesus who stretches out his hand to catch him has been one that I have turned to over and over again this summer. It certainly feels like we're in the midst of a storm, doesn't it? The threat of COVID-19 swirls around us and we would like God to just take it away, just as the apostles in the boat did, I'm sure. But, Jesus doesn't calm the storm until he gets into the boat with them. Before that, he walks along with them, reaching out to save Peter when he falters in his faith walk. This is an important lesson for us today. God accompanies us throughout our lives and reaches out his hand to draw us into heaven. In the meantime, he walks with us and calls us to put our trust in him, especially during the stormy times of our lives.

It is with this trust in God that we begin, once again, the various parish activities, carefully observing state and local restrictions to ensure as safe an environment as possible for all. After months of careful preparation, our school will open for in-person sessions later this week. I want to thank Bud Tosti, our school principal, the members of our outstanding School Opening Task Force and our dedicated school staff for their hard work in preparing for in-person schooling. After struggling through several months of virtual schooling in the spring, we all recognize the tremendous benefit in-person schooling offers our children so, following archdiocesan, state and local guidelines, we worked very hard to make it possible. And, to further protect our children, we have suspended CYO sports activities until further notice. But, other CYO activities are being planned. We are still evaluating how to offer our PREP classes and plan to begin them later this month.

Other parish activities are beginning in a variety of configurations. As you will read elsewhere in this Parish Bulletin, Walking with Purpose will meet in person in the church and parish center to allow for adequate social distancing and will also offer its sessions virtually if there is sufficient interest in that option. After transitioning very successfully to Google Meet sessions last March, our Bible Study/Faith Sharing will continue virtually for the time being every Thursday morning, 9:00 – 11:30am. Anyone interested in joining in should contact the rectory to sign up. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) will also begin later this month. Several people have already contacted me about RCIA; if you're interested, please contact me at halb@sksparish.org or call the rectory. The Knights of Columbus and the parish Evangelization Team will resume their meetings in person with virtual access for those unable to attend in person. Other parish organizations are still formulating their plans and the coordinators of the various organizations will communicate their plans in upcoming weeks.

As we continue to navigate this coronavirus pandemic storm, I've heard from so many of you about your fears and concerns. I share your fears and concerns but am also assured by our Lord's presence in the midst of this storm. Just as previous generations have survived similar pandemics, we will survive this one. And, my faith in God and Jesus' call to put our trust in him strengthens my resolve to continue to do God's work – just in new ways! I hope you will continue to turn to our Lord as I do, and find strength and courage to overcome your fears and join in continuing the work God calls us all to do: to proclaim his saving presence in our midst!

GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND

Every Good Friday, we take up a special collection to support the Christians living in the Holy Land. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the collection this year was postponed until next Sunday, 13 September; it is the Sunday closest to the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a particular solemnity in Jerusalem among Christians who suffer so greatly under the oppressive restrictions that the Israeli government has placed on them. You probably don't still have your envelope for that special collection and, for the safety of our ministers of hospitality and our congregation, we are still asking you to place your contributions in the bins at the church entrances or mail them in to the rector if you're not contributing electronically. So, I ask that you bring your contribution in a specially marked envelope and place it in the bins next week or mail it to the rectory at your earliest convenience. In the meantime, please join me in prayer for our fellow Christians in the Holy Land, that they may remain strong in their commitment to remain in the land our Lord blessed by his presence.
