From the desk of Monsignor Brouwers



As we begin Catholic Schools Week with the theme, “Catholic Schools: Faith. Excellence. Service,” I want to call your attention to the logo that the National Catholic Education Associate has developed for this year. In presenting this logo, the NCEA offers this explanation:

The logo emphasizes that the Catholic school, like the Catholic Church, is not a building or an institution, but it is the people. As the people of God, we are called to work together to bring the Kingdom of God to earth and raise up the next generation to do the same. The image of teachers and students forming the foundation of the school shows that they are active people of faith who serve others and God. Catholic schools have a specific purpose to form students to be good citizens of the world, love God and neighbor and enrich society with the leaven of the gospel and by example of faith. As communities of faith, Catholic schools instill in students their destiny to become saints. Academic excellence is the hallmark of Catholic education intentionally directed to the growth of the whole person – mind, body and spirit. Finally, service is fundamental to Catholic education and the core of Catholic discipleship. Service is intended to help form people who are not only witnesses to Catholic social teaching, but also active participants through social learning.

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia has enjoyed a very strong tradition of Catholic education that dates back to the late 18th century, with the establishment of a parochial school at St. Mary parish. By 1860, under the leadership of our fourth bishop, Saint John Neumann, there were 17 parish elementary schools in Philadelphia. By 1911, there were 68,000 students in Catholic schools throughout the Archdiocese. And, in 1916, our own St. Katharine School opened with a surprisingly high enrollment of 168 students (Msgr. Charles F. Kavanaugh, the pastor of our young parish – it was founded in 1893 – had only anticipated 100 students) who crowded into six classrooms. Thanks to the long, consistent history of an excellent faculty and staff, our school has continued to grow. While so many other Catholic schools throughout our Archdiocese have closed or consolidated, our enrollment today is a very strong 414 students and our school, under the visionary and enthusiastic leadership of our principal, Mr. Bud Tosti, and the outstanding guidance of our wonderful teachers and staff, continues to thrive, even in the midst of the pandemic! I am particularly impressed by how our Home and School Board has demonstrated such imagination in hosting Halloween Scarecrow and Christmas Gingerbread House contests as well as an inspirational Living Nativity. These all raised our spirits and kept our community strong despite the social distancing restrictions we have all been called to observe. I also continue to be encouraged by the enthusiasm, dedication and imagination of our recently-formed Board of Limited Jurisdiction. You will recall that this Board was established just two years ago to assist us in the marketing, enrollment and development for the school. It has already hosted two young alumni reunions as well as an extremely successful *Leap for SKS* last 29 February. This event was both an opportunity for classmates through the years to reunite and everyone to show their financial support for our wonderful school; it netted \$218,000! This financial support is so important for the health of our school. Although tuition payments cover most school expenses, the parish contributes as well; over the past ten years, it has provided an average of 12% of the school operating costs. Everyone in the parish who contributes to our Sunday collections contributes to the operation of the school so, in the name of our students, I thank you!

Yes, teaching our children about faith, excellence and service is essential for the continued mission of our parish and, indeed, the entire Church. As we celebrate *Catholic Schools Week*, let's thank God for our strong and vibrant school and rededicate ourselves – each of us – to teaching our children the wondrous ways of our faith! May we all strive to live in active service of Jesus and his mission as we join together with the rest of the Catholic schools throughout our country in celebrating *Catholic Schools Week*.

Low-Gluten Hosts Available at Mass

As more people become aware of celiac disease, which, according to a recent report in the World of Gastroenterology, "now affects one in 100 people in Europe and North America," low-gluten hosts (i.e., with a gluten content of 0.01 percent) are available at Mass for those who request them. Please contact the rectory during regular office hours or text Msgr. Brouwers directly (610-420-8749) at least fifteen minutes before the Mass you plan to attend so the hosts can be ready for you.

Parish Nurse Ministry

Reminders for dealing with the cold:

1. Drink plenty of fluids, eat a healthy diet, avoid caffeine and alcohol before going outside.
2. Check to make sure you have plenty of batteries.
3. No generator should be inside the home. Place the generator at least 20 feet from the house.
4. Never shovel or go walking alone in frigid weather.
5. Wear no-slip boots when shoveling.
6. Shovel on an hourly basis instead of all at once.
7. Push snow to the side and lift with legs, not back, with no twist of the torso.
8. If you have a life alert, keep it on you at all times.
