From the desk of Monsignor Brouwers

EASTER GREETINGS

Alleluia! Our Lord is risen and offers us new life! We certainly need to hear this message this year as we find ourselves still surrounded by suffering and death after a year of assault by a powerful virus. The Paschal mystery proclaims that Jesus, truly man - the son of Mary - really died on the cross and then overcame the power of death as he rose on Easter. The resurrection of the body, the central mystery of Easter, is an essential Christian doctrine. As the apostle Paul declares so clearly: “[I]f the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished” (1 Cor. 15:13–18). Because, as Paul tells us, the Christian life is meaningless without this essential belief, it has been infallibly defined by the Church from its earliest days. It is included in the three professions of faith: the Apostles’ Creed, the Athanasian Creed and the Nicene Creed. We recite the Nicene Creed at Mass every Sunday and profess that Jesus “was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day.” It is this miracle – life overcoming death – that we celebrate with such great joy today and throughout the Easter season! This encouraging Good News lifts our spirits in the midst of so much bad news as we continue to struggle through the pandemic.


It is important for us to reflect on our Lord’s Resurrection because it didn’t affect only Jesus of Nazareth. It is the foundation of our eternal hope, as well. We continue in the Nicene Creed to profess that the risen Lord “will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.” We, who work throughout our lives here on earth to bring about God’s kingdom in our midst here and now, long to be part of God’s kingdom that “will have no end.” And so, we continue in the Nicene Creed to proclaim that we “look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.” Acknowledging that we all will die - whether it is from the coronavirus, cancer, a car accident, old age or any other cause - this remarkable teaching brings us hope as we look forward to “the world to come” with its unimaginable joy in God’s presence!

Allow me to quote the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* which provides a poetic presentation of our belief in the resurrection of the dead:

“We believe in the true resurrection of this flesh that we now possess” (Council of Lyons II). We sow a corruptible body in the tomb, but he raises up an incorruptible body, a ‘spiritual body’ (cf. 1 Cor 15:42–44)” (CCC 1017).

Using the image of a plant that is sown, the *Catechism* affirms that we will receive an incorruptible body after death. This means that each of us, individually, will be given eternal life. This is our ultimate goal and one that fills all of us – faithful to God and the way his son, Jesus, has shown us – with inextinguishable joy!

We struggle with the news of so many people who have gotten sick and died from the coronavirus – some even in our midst – and we look forward with hope to the time when the vaccines will help us to finally overcome this virus so that we can live. As followers of the risen Lord, however, we look forward to an even better time when we will overcome death altogether and are raised to everlasting life. Death doesn’t have the final say for us. Our God is a God of the living and, through his son, our Lord, Jesus Christ, he leads us to eternal life with him. Let us contemplate the new life that the risen Lord promises us during these days of Easter! Our Lord has been raised from the dead and, aware that we are raised to new life with him, “Alleluia” is our cry!



SCHOOL NEWS

Dear SKS Parishioners,

Two important constituents of our school community that help our school move forward in so many different ways are these two important organizations: the Home and School Board and the Board of Limited Jurisdiction. What are these two boards and how do they help our school?

Home and School Board

The objective of the Home and School Association, as defined in its by-laws, is the advancement of Catholic education and the welfare of all the school children of Saint Katharine of Siena parish; to promote parent-school activities and increase, on the part of its members, interest in educational and civic affairs, and to increase the knowledge of education and its processes on the part of parents and teachers by increasing mutual understanding of children, and by providing an opportunity for parents and teachers to work together for the good of the child.

Our Home and School Board has been in existence for many years prior to my coming here 19 years ago. Since my time here, this board has been a key cornerstone in the life of this school, making contributions not just financially to the school's sustainability, but just as important, if not more important, helping promote strong Catholic identity and contributing to the school's close knit and caring sense of community for our parish school.

The Home & School Board serves our school throughout the calendar year by:

- * Planning/organizing important school community events that take place, such as the Fall Parents Social, Breakfast with Santa, SKS Trivia Night, The SK5K, just to name a few. Through the hard work of this Board, events such as these foster a strong sense of communal spirit throughout our community. Some of these events have been on hold due to the pandemic. However, the H&S Board has been both responsive and creative by finding new ways to keep us close as a community: the Scarecrow Contest, Live Nativity and the Gingerbread House are just a few examples.
- * Assisting school financially by using some social events as fundraisers to help support the operating cost of running the school and contributing to school improvement needs.
- * Promoting the school and create community in particular by welcoming new SKS families through a new parent orientation.
- * Open house tours for prospective families.
- * Coordinating homeroom parents from each classroom to assist teachers with volunteer support and in planning of classroom celebrations.
- * Planning activities and events that support a positive school culture specifically to support teachers, staff and students.
- * Arranging opportunities through the H&S Speaker series to educate the school community on various important topics that impact their children and family life.
- * Helping with publicity and marketing of the school through publication of the SKS Spirit Newsletter.
