From the desk of Monsignor Brouwers

FAREWELL and GOD BLESS MSGR. CARROLL!



"You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek" (Psalm 110:4)

Seventeen years ago, Msgr. Carroll retired as pastor of St. Hilary of Poitiers parish, Rydal, PA, and Msgr. Jagodzinski invited him to come here as a senior priest. This is a designation given to a priest who has reached the age of 70 and is able to continue serving but is no longer required to be involved in administrative duties. Five years later, having reached the canonical retirement age, Msgr. Carroll chose to stay here, celebrating Sunday and daily Masses, assisting with hospital visitation and funerals and sharing his gentle Irish humor with everyone he met.

Now, due to his age and continuing health issues, Msgr. Carroll has decided that it is time for him to really retire and he has been given a very comfortable suite at *Villa St. Joseph*, the residence for retired Archdiocesan priests. Next Sunday, our parish *Knights of Columbus* will host a reception for Msgr. Carroll in the parish center following the 9:30am Mass. Everyone is invited to thank Msgr. Carroll for his many years of gracious service here and wish him well as he begins the next step in his priestly ministry: praying for all of us!

Msgr. Carroll recently celebrated the 60th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood and has had a variety of demanding and exciting assignments over his six decades of very active priestly ministry. After two assignments as assistant pastor, first at St. Mark parish in Bristol and then at St. Martin of Tours in New Hope, he was assigned to teach at Bishop Kenrick High School in Norristown and then as the assistant superintendent for all of the Catholic schools throughout the archdiocese. He was next appointed the vice rector and then rector at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. After faithfully serving the archdiocese in the educational apostolate for many years, he returned to parish ministry as pastor of two parishes, first St. Timothy in Philadelphia and then St. Hilary of Poitiers in Rydal. He was then asked to become the archdiocesan liaison for ecumenical and interreligious affairs, a position he continued to hold even in his retirement.

Msgr. Carroll was also very active in the preparation for and celebration of the 41st International Eucharistic Congress that our archdiocese hosted in 1976. And, he takes great pride in his role as band director when he was stationed at Bishop Kenrick High School. He has, indeed, been blessed with a very active ministry in a wide variety of assignments and has touched the lives – and funny bones – of countless people throughout his 60 years of service in our archdiocese. As he now finally moves into full retirement, I invite you to join in celebrating his years here and wishing him all of God's blessings next Sunday, 6 June, following the 9:30am Mass in our parish center. Ad multos annos, Msgr. Carroll!

TRINITY SUNDAY

"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." This is how we Christians begin all our prayers because we believe in and worship a triune God. But, what do we actually mean when we say that God is a Trinity? As we celebrate Trinity Sunday, allow me to offer some reflections on this very important mystery of our faith. I think it can be of particular significance to us at this time as we slowly emerge from a year of isolation and realize ever more clearly how important our connection with others is, whether it be our extended family, friends or parish community. We are, by nature, part of a community and this is reflected in our being created in the image and likeness of God who, though one, is a communion of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

First of all, it is important to realize we are dealing with a mystery, a reality that is well beyond our total understanding, just as the Incarnation and Resurrection are mysteries beyond our full comprehension. Our words, our concepts, our minds, cannot adequately grasp or describe this aspect of God – just as we are incapable of completely understanding or expressing any aspect of God. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states so well, "[t]he mystery of the Trinity in itself is inaccessible to the human mind and is the object of faith only because it was revealed by Jesus Christ, the divine Son of the eternal Father" (CCC, p. 902). But, we can speak about God as a Trinity because it has been revealed to us. And, it is very important for us to reflect on the Trinity because it is at the center of our faith. To quote the *Catechism* again, "[t]he mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is, therefore, the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith'" (CCC, 234). So, it is essential that we have some understanding and appreciation of this "most fundamental" mystery of our faith.

As we profess every Sunday when we recite the Nicene Creed, "I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible." God first revealed himself to Israel as the almighty creator and heavenly father. The two *Genesis* creation accounts speak of his creative power and demonstrate his fatherly care as he prepares the Garden of Eden and places humanity there. In his final address to Israel before his death, Moses reminds Israel: "Is he not your father who created you?" (*Dt* 32:6)

After Jesus was baptized in the Jordan, "the skies opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in visible form like a dove. A voice from heaven was heard to say: 'You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests'" (*Lk* 3:22). And so we see Jesus begin to be revealed as the Son of God, a revelation that is expressed most clearly in Jesus' address to his apostles on the night before he was crucified: "Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (*Jn* 14:11) and in his prayer for his followers that same night: "I pray...that all may be one as you, Father, are in me, and I in you" (*Jn* 17:21). As we profess in the creed, Jesus is "the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father."

Although the Holy Spirit has been at work since the creation of the world and has, as we recognize in the creed when we say, "spoken through the prophets," it is Jesus who reveals him to us. At the Last Supper, Jesus tells his apostles that "I will ask the Father and he will give you another Paraclete" (*Jn* 14:16). He then assures them that "the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will instruct you in everything, and remind you of all that I told you" (*Jn* 14:26). We profess in the creed that we "believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son."



Here at St. Katharine's, we have many ways to experience the life and work of the Trinity in our midst! Whether it is in the daily or Sunday Eucharistic celebration – the most important work of our faith community – or through any of the many other parish organizations and activities, even during these challenging times, we are sharing in the life of the Blessed Trinity! As God's faithful stewards, we build community here in the parish, reflecting the mystery of the Trinity and making it known right here in our midst! "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all!"
