# From the desk of Monsignor Brouwers

# UPDATE ON THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The national pilgrimage leading up to the Eucharistic Congress is fast approaching! Allow me to provide an update on this sacred time of adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament. As you surely know, the Eucharistic Congress will be held at the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, IN, from 17 until 21 July this year. Attendance at this 10<sup>th</sup> National Eucharistic Congress will be an inspiration time for everyone. Families are especially encouraged to attend. There will be plenty of kid friendly activities throughout the week to bring children of all ages into an ever deeper relationship with Jesus present in the Blessed Sacrament.

In preparation for the Eucharistic Congress, four Eucharistic Pilgrimages will approach Indianapolis from north, south, west and east beginning on 17 May. The Marian Route will begin at the headwaters of the Mississippi River. The San Diego Route will start in Brownsville, TX. San Francisco will be the starting point for the Serra Route and the Seton Route will originate in New Haven, CT. The Eucharistic Pilgrimages and the National Eucharistic Congress are the highlights of the parish phase of the Eucharistic Revival that started last June. They are offered to help us fall deeper in love with our Lord, Jesus, present in the Eucharist and follow him more closely. Participating in the Pilgrimage and/or the Eucharistic Congress allows us opportunities to mirror our internal journey with an external journey, connecting body and soul in our pursuit of Jesus. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is not one event or a road trip. It is an exciting opportunity for all of us Catholics throughout our country to visibly demonstrate our desire for a Eucharistic revival.

It will be more convenient for most of us to join in the Seton Route named after St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first American-born saint. The pilgrimage will pass through the Philadelphia area from 30 May through 3 June beginning at Holy Trinity Church, Morrisville, on 30 May with celebrations at St. Christopher, Holy Innocents and Sacred Heart Churches in Philadelphia over the next two days. On Sunday morning, 2 June, Archbishop Pérez will celebrate a special Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Ss. Peter and Paul. Pilgrims will also venerate the tombs of St. John Neumann and St. Katherine Drexel, two saints with Philadelphia ties and then join in a special Eucharistic celebration that evening at St. Laurence Church, Upper Darby. On 3 June, Ss. Simon & Jude and St. Agnes Churches in West Chester will hold special Eucharistic celebrations before the Eucharistic Pilgrimage leaves our archdiocese and moves on to the Diocese of Harrisburg. Portions of the pilgrimage will be on foot and we will be welcome to join both the pilgrimage and the special Eucharistic celebrations so mark your calendars and plan to join in!

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton wrote: "Jesus is as a fire in the very center of our souls ever burning. Yet, we are cold because we do not stay by it." Let us use this sacred time to come close to Jesus and become ever more enflamed in his love.

# Parish Lenten Retreat Wednesday, March 13th


Please join us for a night of reflection. There will be a light soup and bread supper starting at 6:15pm followed by a presentation at 6:45pm by Monsignor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For over 50 years, the Collection for the Church in Latin America has been taken up as a sign of solidarity between the Church in the United States and the Church in Latin America and the Caribbean as well our concern for our sisters and brothers in those places.

The work of evangelization is carried out by Christians who meet people where they are—not only in a geographical sense but also in the context of culture. This collection also supports other important issues such as human trafficking and the abuse of children and vulnerable people, two serious violations of human dignity that require urgent and comprehensive resources from the Church, governments, and human rights organizations.

In South America, the Brazilian Bishops' Conference organized visits and meetings to engage Afro-Brazilian Catholic leaders to discuss a variety of themes, including pastoral ministry and the vision of Pope Francis. In addition, Peruvian missionaries working in the Amazon brought the Gospel to the Ashaninka and Matsigenka communities of about 60,000 people.

In the Peruvian Prelature of Chuquibambilla the Collection for the Church in Latin America helped to fund and implement a program to prevent abuse of children and vulnerable people through a training for Church leaders. It consisted of alliance-building initiatives with healthcare and law enforcement organizations and the creation of protocols to address reported incidents of abuse.

Your support for the Collection for the Church in Latin America is vital to these efforts aimed at evangelization, the protection of those most at risk, and so much more.

Our local Church will take up this Collection during the weekend of March 9 and 10, 2024. Please take this opportunity to be generous in supporting the families of Latin America and the Caribbean. Be assured that you are remembered in my prayers.
