From the desk of Monsignor Browwers

CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA COLLECTION

We all know how important it is to grow in our knowledge of and relationship with God. After all, we are all preparing to spend eternity with him! God has blessed us by revealing himself to us down through the ages, especially through the prophets and in person through his son, Jesus Christ. We are blessed here in America with many Catholic colleges and universities that help our children continue to learn about God as they prepare for their careers and adult lives. Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., is the only institution of higher education founded by the U.S. Bishops and chartered by the Vatican. It enjoys the distinction of being the national university of the Catholic Church and is charged with educating the future leaders of the Church, nation and the world. It is a national research university with more than 5,000 undergraduate and graduate students. It offers more than 250 academic programs on a residential campus that provides a transformative experience – academically, spiritually and socially – to prepare students for a life of meaning and purpose in accordance with our Catholic faith. I had the privilege of studying Sacred Scriptures at CUA (1984 – 86) in its outstanding doctoral program under such world renowned theologians as Fr. Joseph A. Fitzmyer, S. J., who was the general editor for the authoritative *Jerome Biblical Commentary*, and Fr. John Meyers, recognized worldwide for his scholarship on the writings of St. John.

The founders of CUA set down the following first principle: "The teaching of the University should be faithfully Catholic, conformed in all things to the creed of the Church and the decisions of the Holy See." It is still faithfully Catholic today. So, it is particularly important to support CUA today, at a time when so many people – including Catholics – are being misled away from the truth of the Gospel. Our annual collection for the Catholic University of America will be taken up next weekend. Please be generous so this institution can continue to educate a very important generation of Catholic leaders.



POPE LEO XIV'S FAMILY TREE

It has been just three months since 132 cardinals from around the world elected our new pope, Leo XIV. His election boasts a number of firsts: the first American, the first Augustinian and the first graduate from Villanova University! We all remember the excitement we felt when we learned of his election on 8 May! And, we have been eager to learn more about him as his papacy unfolds.

One of the fascinating aspects about Pope Leo XIV is his family background. There has been such great interest in this that researchers have traced his lineage back 15 generations, all the way to the 16th century. This research has uncovered that his roots come from France, Italy, Spain, Cuba, Canada, Haiti, Guadeloupe and the United States. His ancestors include both African slaves and slaveholders and he is related, albeit somewhat remotely, to such well-known figures as Pierre and Justin Trudeau, Hillary Clinton, Angelina Jolie, Justin Bieber and Madonna. Of course, all of this provides a deeper understanding into the pope's character and view of humanity. As Archbishop George Leo Thomas from Las Vegas said recently, "Pope Leo's diverse bloodline is a blessing to people and nations around the world, making him a spiritual father to all."

Pope Leo's mother, Mildred Agnes, was born in Chicago in 1911. Her parents, Joseph Martinez and Louise Baquié, had moved there from Louisiana where they had identified themselves as Black or mulatto in census records; they each had Black and Creole ancestry. So, Pope Leo joins three other popes who are believed to be of African origin: Pope Victor I (189-199), Pope Miltiades (311-314) and Pope Gelasius I (492-496).

His father, Louis Marius Prevost, was a Chicago native, having grown up in Hyde Park. Like his mother, our pope's father has some interesting aspects to his background, as well. He received his last name, Prevost, in an unusual way. His grandfather, Salvatore Giovanni Gaetano Riggitano (he went by Giovanni), immigrated to the United States from Sicily in 1903. He married Daisy Hughes in April 1914 at Immanuel Baptist Church in Chicago. Less than three years later, however, in March 1917, Daisy had Giovanni and another woman, Suzanne Fontaine (who had emigrated from France in 1916), arrested on suspicion of adultery. At that time, adultery was not only illegal but also civilly punishable. It is not clear how this legal case was settled nor is there any evidence that Giovanni and Daisy divorced but in July 1917, Suzanne gave birth to a boy in a home for unwed mothers. In 1920, she gave birth to a second son, Louis, who would become the father of Pope Leo. Giovanni and Suzanne lived together for the rest of Giovanni's life – about 40 years. Both took on the last name of Suzanne's mother's maiden name: Prevost. This is a surname of French origin and refers to a high-ranking official or magistrate. So far, genealogists have found no evidence that Giovanni and Suzanne ever married.

Whatever the origins of their relationship, Giovanni (who began to go by John, the English form of the name) and Suzanne lived as Catholics and both had Catholic funerals when they died, John in 1960 and Suzanne in 1979. Suzanne even became a Third Order Carmelite. They raised their two boys in the Catholic faith.

If we look closely enough, most of us can find similarly unusual circumstances in our ancestry. And, if we examine the genealogy of Jesus as recorded in the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel, we will find that it includes idolaters, murderers, prostitutes and adulterers; King David is a prime example of that! Of course, Jesus' genealogy – as well as ours – is a reminder that no one is beyond salvation. For our time, Pope Leo's ancestry reassures us that, no matter our origin or even our present state of life, we can all turn to Jesus to save us – and he will!
