# From the desk of Monsignor Brouwe

## Solemnity of All Saints and Feast of All Souls

Ready or not, next Saturday is already the first day of November! We will join with the universal Church in celebrating the *Solemnity of All Saints*. Since it occurs on a Saturday, it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year. We will not celebrate a Vigil Mass on Friday and will celebrate the regular 8:00am Mass on Saturday. Although it is not a Holy Day of Obligation, I encourage you to attend the 8:00am Mass as we celebrate this important solemnity. We find encouragement throughout the year in celebrating the feasts of particular saints. On the *Solemnity of All Saints*, however, we join with all the saints in heaven who are already enjoying the full celebration of the eternal banquet our God has prepared for all his beloved.

Next Sunday, we will celebrate the *Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed,* commonly known as *All Souls*. It has been many years since we celebrated this feast on a Sunday; the last time was in 2014. Both of these annual feasts speak powerfully about one of the very important tenets of our faith – belief in everlasting life for everyone. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* offers us clear teachings on our relationship with those who have died and are in Purgatory as well as the saints in Heaven:

§954 The three states of the Church. "When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is". (Lumen Gentium 49; cf. Mt 25:31)

All of us, however, in varying degrees and in different ways share in the same charity towards God and our neighbors, and we all sing the one hymn of glory to our God. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have his Spirit form one Church and in Christ cleave together.

§955 "So it is that the union of the wayfarers with the brethren who sleep in the peace of Christ is in no way interrupted, but on the contrary, according to the constant faith of the Church, this union is reinforced by an exchange of spiritual goods." (*Lumen Gentium* 49)

§956 The intercession of the saints. "Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness....[T]hey do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and men, Christ Jesus.... So by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped." (Lumen Gentium 49; cf. I Tim 2:5)

The *Catechism* then quotes St. Dominic's admonition to his brothers on his deathbed:

"Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life."

Yes, we are all part of one Church, gathered together by our Lord. As most of the Mass prefaces acknowledge, we join with the saints in praising our God with endless acclaim. And, at every Mass, we remember those who are still in Purgatory. We pray for "our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection and all who have died in your mercy" (Second Eucharistic Prayer) and we ask God to give them "kind admittance to your kingdom" (Third Eucharistic Prayer).

The Church has traditionally dedicated the entire month of November to prayers for all the souls of the faithful departed. Fr. Kien and I assure you that we will remember all of your beloved family members who have died, especially those you listed on your *All Souls* envelopes, which will be kept next to the tabernacle throughout the month. And, all those who have lost a loved one over the past year have been invited to come to the 11:30am Mass next Sunday, 2 November, where their loved ones will be remembered as we all offer prayers for their eternal happiness. Both of these celebrations - *All Saints* and *All Souls* - offer us a good opportunity to reflect on the ultimate purpose of our lives - union with God and all the faithful in the everlasting joy of Heaven!
